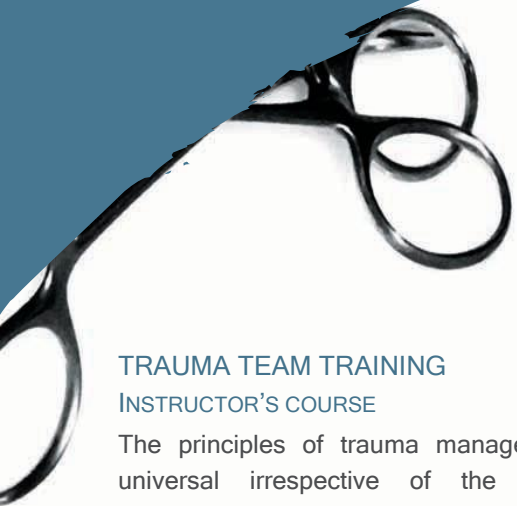

## TRAUMA TEAM TRAINING INSTRUCTOR'S COURSE

The principles of trauma management are universal irrespective of the source of destructive energy (whether it be a landmine or a motor vehicle) and irrespective of the caregiver's educational level. The Trauma Team Training Course (TTT™) is designed to help personnel apply these principles to all types of injury.

TTT™ is unique because the unit of instruction is not the individual but the team. The team is comprised of personnel who handle acute emergencies in most low-income country hospitals; often, this does not include doctors and, if it does, they are junior doctors.

The Trauma Team Training Course was developed and tested in several formats since June of 1998 under the auspices of the Injury Control Center-Uganda (ICC- U), with funding from the Canadian Network for International Surgery (CNIS) and the Canadian International Development Agency (CIDA).

**COURSE OBJECTIVE:** "To teach surgeons, emergency physicians and other medical specialists how to teach personnel at the technical level to apply the principles of trauma management at centers with limited resources."
